JC:P69 ESSAYS SUBMITTED BY RONALD PUGH (MATR. 1951) FOR THE GLADSTONE MEMORIAL PRIZE AND EXHIBITION

Ronald Pugh came up to Jesus College in 1951 to read History. In 1953 he won the Gladstone Memorial Prize for his essay at **JC:P69/MSI/1** below, and on getting a First in History in 1954, stayed on to do postgraduate research, being awarded a D. Phil. in 1957. During this period, he was awarded a Gladstone Memorial Exhibition, and wrote the essay **JC:P69/MSI/2** in fulfilment of the conditions of the award.

Both essays were presented to the Fellows' Library at an unknown date, but were transferred to the archives in 2008, and assigned the Accession Number 128 in the spring of 2016.
